

Will of Edward Higham of Faulkbourne, farmer, 1798

- To my wife Margaret Newton Higham: copyhold messuage and 30 acres called Godfreys otherwise Crackborns in White Notley, Essex, and all my other copyhold in White Notley, for her natural life. After her death, to be sold and the proceeds to be divided between my daughters:
 - Margaret, wife of John Barnard of Faulkbourne, farmer
 - Elizabeth, wife of William Humphreys of White Notley, victualler
 - Jane Higham
 - Julia Higham
- (and also) To my daughters Julia and Jane Higham, £50 each after my wife's death
- To my son Edward Higham: £5, two guns or fowling pieces, and all the rest, residue and remainder of my estate.
- If there is enough for my daughters above mentioned to have £150 each, then to include my daughter Ann, wife of John Grimwood of Kelvedon, farmer, share and share alike.
- Execs: wife Ann, friends Joseph Nunn of Rivenhall and Abraham Barnard of White Notley (farmers).
