

Will of John Constable of Little Bromley, yeoman

Written: 27 April 1701

- Son John Constable of Langham 20 shillings
- Son Daniel Constable of Little Horkesley 20 shillings
- Son Hugh Constable of Mount Bures 20 shillings
- Son Benjamin Constable £30
- Daughter Elizabeth Constable £20
- Daughter Hannah Constable
 - Two houses and a piece of meadow land in Stratford, Suffolk
 - £20 wen she reaches 18

Corn, cattle, household and all other my chattels to pay debts and legacies, providing (another?) £20 for Hannah when she is 18.

If more money is raised than is necessary to cover the legacies, the surplus is to be divided between Benjamin, Elizabeth and Hannah. If not enough is raised, then Benjamin, Elizabeth and Hannah are to cover the shortfall from their own portions.

Executors: Benjamin and Hannah

Witnesses: Saml Carter, John Scarpe jnr, Thomas Mimes

1 May 1701: Benjamin renounces executorship in favour of his brother John.
